
About CityU

City University of Hong Kong (CityU, 香港城市大学), one of the eight government-funded institutions in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR), is a modern, hi-tech institution committed to providing a quality learning environment for its students and the community. It has a vibrant research culture and has gained an excellent reputation for research and innovation in a wide range of disciplines. It has an outstanding team of academics dedicated to advancing knowledge to benefit society and the region.

Research Degree Programmes

The Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) programme is offered in the following academic units covering a wide range of strategic areas to suit individuals' research interests:

Admission Requirements

CityU has adopted a rigorous admission mechanism in selecting high quality research students. Candidates seeking admission to our joint PhD programmes should be current PhD students at home university or will become a PhD student at home university upon commencement of study under the joint PhD programme.

Please note that CityU adopts stringent admission criteria and we welcome students with truly outstanding qualification.

English Proficiency Requirement

Candidates are required to satisfy the University's minimum English proficiency requirement for postgraduate programmes, that is, 550 (paper-based test)/ 79 (internet-based test)/ 59 (revised paper-delivered test; sum of Reading, Listening and Writing section scores) in the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or an overall band score of 6.5 in the International English Language Testing System (IELTS). In addition to the University's requirement, individual Colleges and Schools may set a higher standard suitable for their disciplines. TOEFL and IELTS scores are considered valid for two years from the test date and must be valid at the time of submission of application.

Programme Duration

The normal duration of the joint PhD programme is 4 years. The commencement date of research degree programmes is the first day of September to align with the beginning of an academic year.

During the candidature of the joint PhD programme, students will study at home university, CityU's main campus in Hong Kong and designated study locations in Mainland China, which currently includes USTC–CityU Joint Advanced Research Centre (Suzhou) (中国科学技术大学 — 香港城市大学联合高等研究中心 (苏州)) and CityU Shenzhen Research Institute (CityUSRI, 香港城市大学深圳研究院).



Programme Structure

The degree of PhD shall consist of coursework and independent research studies culminating in the submission of a thesis.

During their period of candidature, students are required to:

1. Submit Qualifying/Annual Progress Report annually to report their study progress.
2. Obtain a minimum of 14 credit units (including at least 9 credit units of core courses and at least 2 credit units of research methodology and ethics course at postgraduate level). Individual Colleges/Schools/Departments may stipulate a higher credit unit requirement.
3. Complete a compulsory online training course on research integrity, namely Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI) programme
4. Pass a mandatory Qualifying Examination within the specified period

Medium of Instruction/ Assessment and Thesis Presentation

The normal medium of instruction and assessment at CityU is English. Research students should write and present their theses in English.

Supervisory Arrangements

Students will follow a dual supervisor system (双导师制). These two supervisors from CityU and the home university will jointly discuss and decide on course selection, research direction and thesis title and so on for their student.



Tuition Fees

The tuition fee for full-time non-government funded research degree programme is HK\$7,016* (~US\$900) per month during studies at Hong Kong main campus of CityU. CityU will provide a tuition grant to cover 50% of the tuition fee and the remaining 50% will be deducted from the monthly studentship.

During studies at CityU's designated study location in Mainland China, students are also required to pay a tuition fee, while it is fully subsidized by CityU*.

Financial Assistance

Postgraduate Studentship/Stipend is available for eligible students under the joint PhD programme. The monthly rate is HK\$17,510@ (~US\$2,245) during studies at Hong Kong main campus of CityU, RMB2,900@ during studies at USTC-CityU Joint Advanced Research Centre (Suzhou) and RMB4,900@ during studies at CityUSRI. To foster academic exchange, an annual PhD Student Workshop is organized and students under the joint PhD programme can receive a subsidy which covers accommodation and travel expenses during the activity period.

In addition, to help widen students' academic exposure, CityU offers the Peter Ho Conference Scholarships (何稼楠学术会议奖学金) at RMB15,000 to students under the joint PhD programme in support of attending overseas conferences.

Student Accommodation

During studies at CityU Hong Kong main campus and CityUSRI, students are responsible for arranging accommodation on their own.



Personal Accident and Medical Insurance/ Travel Insurance

All non-local students are required to purchase a personal accident and medical insurance/travel insurance policy during their study period at CityU. The insurance policy shall be arranged on behalf of the students by the Global Engagement Office (GEO). The estimated insurance premium per annum is around HK\$266 (~US\$35) [rate for 2020/21 and subject to revision] which will be charged after enrolment.

Cost of Living

Non-local students are required to pay for their own travel expenses to and from Hong Kong, including airfare. The estimated average cost of living for a single student in Hong Kong is around HK\$11,000 (~US\$1,410) per month to cover tuition fees, food, lodging and general living expenses.

The Postgraduate Studentship for research degree students should be sufficient to support students' daily living expenses. Students will receive their financial assistance at the end of each calendar month during their study with CityU, subject to compliance of regulations.



Support to Students' Studies

The Chow Yei Ching School of Graduate Studies (SGS, 周亦卿研究生院) aims to provide better coordination and strategic direction to ensure the continued development of postgraduate studies at CityU. SGS offers a training course to prepare students to undertake a limited teaching role. Besides, SGS also runs a Postgraduate Forum on a regular basis with an aim to support students' research studies. It also compiles publications relating to graduate studies to recognize their hard work and perseverance.

The Global Engagement Office (GEO) provides assistance and support to non-local students, including visa application, orientation programmes, on-arrival assistance, and pastoral care and advice on personal and learning related issues. The website of GEO (<http://www.cityu.edu.hk/geo/>) contains useful information about studying in Hong Kong and at CityU.

Student Development Services (SDS) is committed to enriching students' educational experience and whole person development, through lectures and training courses on counselling, career development, wellness, leadership development, inter-personal relationship, communication, and stress management.

Assessment of Doctoral Thesis and Conferment of Degrees

A joint examination panel (联合答辩委员会) will be formed after students have submitted the doctoral theses, which consists of examiners invited by both CityU and home university. A method of "Voting by both sides in one oral defense" (一次答辩·两边投票) will be employed to fulfill the prescribed requirements of a doctoral degree.

Students studying in the joint PhD Programme must satisfy the requirements of both CityU and home university in order to be awarded with a graduation certificate and a PhD degree certificate. Upon fulfillment of the programme requirements and passing the thesis oral defense prescribed by both universities, a student can then apply for the PhD degree certificates awarded by the two universities. CityU and home university will separately issue the graduation/degree certificate in accordance with their own sets of rules and regulations (CityU's award certificate will indicate that the PhD programme is jointly offered by CityU and home university 城大的学位证书将注明与具体某内地高校联合培养相关字样), and a student of the joint programme can attend graduation ceremonies at both universities.





How to look for a research supervisor at CityU?

1. Visit the official website of City University of Hong Kong at www.cityu.edu.hk
2. Point to "Offices and Department" at the top
3. Choose "Academic Departments"
4. Click on the academic unit that fits your discipline / research area and you will be directed to the relevant website
5. Point to "People (or similar term)"
6. Click on "Faculty (or similar term)"

A list of faculty members will be shown and you can check the profiles, as well as their contacts.

Alternatively, you may visit CityU's webpage for admission to research degree programme (<https://www.cityu.edu.hk/pg/research-degree-programmes>), from which you can find the research areas of all the academic units. Please note that online application is NOT applicable for joint PhD programme and that some information on the admission page is NOT applicable to students under the joint PhD programme.

You should have discussed with your research supervisor at home university and have contacted a proposed CityU research supervisor before submitting the application for the joint PhD programme. It is highly recommended that the two supervisors should reach an initial agreement for you to join the joint PhD programme. Otherwise the process of your application will be delayed.

Application Procedures

Announcement will be made by the Graduate School or HK-Macau-Taiwan Office of the home university. Applications will be open in October of a year for commencement of the joint PhD programme in September of the following year, and the deadline is usually set in late December. All applications must be submitted to and endorsed by the Graduate School or HK-Macau-Taiwan Office of the home university. Students must NOT submit their applications to CityU directly.
